## **Paschal Hours - Without Priest**

**Presiding Reader (head of household):** Through the prayers of our holy fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us and save us.

Choir: Amen. And the Paschal Troparion, Thrice:

Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and upon those in the tombs bestowing life. *(Thrice)* 

And then, in Sticheric Tone 6:

Having beheld the Resur<u>rec</u>tion of Christ, / let us worship the holy Lord <u>Jesus</u>, / the only <u>sin</u>less One. / We venerate Thy <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, / and we praise and glorify Thy holy Resur<u>rec</u>tion; / for <u>Thou</u> art our God / and we know none <u>other</u> than Thee; / we <u>call</u> on Thy Name: / Come, all ye <u>faith</u>ful, / let us venerate Christ's holy Resur<u>rec</u>tion, / for, behold, through the Cross joy is come into <u>all</u> the world. / Let us ever <u>bless</u> the Lord, / praising His Resur<u>rec</u>tion, / VV for by enduring the <u>Cross</u> for us, /// He has de<u>stroy</u>ed <u>death</u> by death. (*Thrice*)

In some places, we add, once, in the same tone and melody:

 Jesus, having <u>risen</u> from the grave / as <u>He</u> foretold, / has given us e<u>ternal life</u>, /// and great <u>mercy</u>!

We then sing the Hypakoe of Pascha, to a special Tone 4 melody, or 'plain', in Troparic Tone 8:

Before the <u>dawn</u> Mary and the <u>women</u> came and found the stone rolled a<u>way</u> from the tomb; / they heard the angelic <u>voice</u>, "Why do you seek among the dead as a man, the One who dwells in ever<u>lasting Light?</u> / Behold, the <u>clothes</u> in the <u>grave</u>; go and pro<u>claim</u> to the world: / The Lord is <u>risen</u>, <u>He</u> has slain death as He is the <u>Son</u> of God, /// saving the <u>race</u> of man."

And the Paschal Kontakion, in Troparic Tone 8:

Thou *didst* descend into the tomb, O Immortal. / Thou *didst* destroy the power of death.
/ In vict'ry didst <u>Thou</u> arise, O <u>Christ</u> God, / proclaiming, 'Rejoice' to the <u>myrrh</u>-bearing women, /// granting peace to <u>Thine</u> apostles and bestowing resurrection on the <u>fallen</u>.

And the following Troparia, in Troparic Tone 8:

- In *the* tomb with the <u>body</u> and in <u>hell</u> with the <u>soul</u> as God, / in Paradise *with* the <u>thief</u> and on the <u>throne</u> with the Father and the <u>Spirit</u>, /// wast *Thou*, O <u>Christ</u>, <u>filling</u> all things, Thyself <u>inf</u>inite.
- Glory *to* the <u>Fa</u>ther and to the <u>Son</u> and to the Holy <u>Spir</u>it. / As *giving* <u>life</u>, as more <u>sple</u>ndid than <u>Pa</u>radise / and *more* radiant than <u>any</u> <u>royal</u> <u>cham</u>ber, O Christ, /// is *shown* forth Thy <u>tomb</u>, the <u>foun</u>tain of our resur<u>rec</u>tion.
- Now *and* ever and <u>un</u>to <u>ages</u> of <u>ages</u>. Amen. / Re*joice*, thou <u>hal</u>lowed, di<u>vine</u> abode of the <u>Most</u> High / for *through* thee, O <u>Theotokos</u>, joy was given to those who cry <u>aloud</u> to thee: /// Blessed art <u>thou</u> among <u>wo</u>men, O <u>Lady</u> most pure.

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## And then, to a sung pattern:

• Lord, have mercy. (40 times)

## And then, again in Troparic Tone 8:

- Glory *to* the <u>Fa</u>ther and to the <u>Son</u> and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen. / More hon'rable *than* the <u>Che</u>rubim, and more <u>glor</u>ious beyond compare than the <u>Se</u>raphim; / with*out* cor<u>rup</u>tion thou <u>gav</u>est birth to <u>God</u> the Word: /// True *The*otokos we magnify thee.
  - And then, 'straight':
- <u>Bless</u>, O Lord.

*Presiding Reader:* Through the prayers of our holy fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us [and save us].

Choir: Amen. And the Paschal Troparion: 'Christ is risen...' (Thrice).

*If the Paschal Hours are to be repeated, we return to the top: having sung the Paschal Troparion, thrice, we begin with Having Beheld the Resurrection, and continue with the rest.* 

But if we are concluding the Paschal Hours, we sing, 'straight':

- Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen. / Lord, have mercy, Lord, have mercy, Lord, have <u>mercy</u>. /// <u>Bless</u>, O Lord.
- **Presiding reader:** O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, who art risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and upon those in the tombs bestowing life: for the sake of the prayers of Thy most pure Mother, of our holy and God-bearing fathers, and of all the saints, have mercy on us and save us, for Thou art good and lovest mankind.

Choir: Amen. And the Paschal Troparion: 'Christ is risen...' (Thrice).

And then, the Paschal Dismissal:

 And *un*to <u>us</u> He has <u>giv</u>en e<u>ter</u>nal life. // Let *us* worship His <u>Res</u>ur<u>rec</u>tion on the <u>third</u> day.
